

chain stitch

1



Start your chain stitch by pulling the thread through at the starting point on your project until you reach the end knot.

2



Move your needle over about 1/4" and push through to the other side. Pull until the thread is flat. Be careful not to over pull, which will cause the fabric to bunch. You want the thread lying nice and flat against the fabric.

3



Go back 1/8" and poke through to the other side. Before pulling the needle through, check the other side...

4



Make sure the needle is poked through halfway through the stitch on the other side, and as close to the stitch as you can make it. Then pull flat.

5



Repeat 1-4 moving over 1/4" each time.

6



Once you have reached the end of the part you are sewing, it should look like a tiny dotted line....



...On both sides.

7



When you turn the project inside out, you should have a firm stitch now holding the pieces in place.
